

I've been collecting charts and kits since 1993 and am still collecting to this day!

Fearless stitching



Try a new technique and embrace the beauty of blackwork in this colourful collection of springtime treats!

ho knew blackwork could be so pretty? Usually worked in one shade (most often black, hence its name), we've given this technique a makeover with pops of colour, thoughtfully placed whole stitches, and perky patterns for a springtime feel you'll be keen to embrace! Turn the page to find a host of motifs you can use again and again. We've used French knots in most of the designs, but you can switch them for seed beads if you fancy!

Stitch Time 3-4 hours (each) **Stitch Types** Whole cross stitch, fractionals, backstitch, French knots

We chat to... Meg Evershed

Get to know the designer behind The Nutmeg Company's amazing 3D cross stitch kits, and this month's clever card set on page 58!

he Nutmeg Company is well known for its amazing 3D structures created from cross stitch. From mini houses to sweet penguins, Meg's creativity knows no bounds, so when she agreed to design the stunning cut-out card set for this month's Weekend project, we couldn't resist finding out about the woman behind those grand designs...

When did you first learn to stitch, and who taught you?

It's difficult to think back that far, but I do remember doing some decorative needlecraft when I first went to school. In those days, we were taught 'needlework' and I think everything flowed from that.

Have you always been experimental with cross stitch?

Yes! I had several puppets and a puppet theatre my father made when I was young. I remember acquiring broken puppets from jumble sales and designing wonderful clothes and characters for them.

What got you into 3D stitching?

I'd made toys for my children, and it occurred to me I could use similar techniques to make three dimensional cross stitch pieces.

How does 3D cross stitch work?

It's a simple concept involving an inner rigid shape to which the cross stitching is attached. The design is stitched flat, as you would stitch a sampler or a picture, then mounted on pieces of plastic canvas which form an inner skeleton. The pieces are then sewn together to make the finished design.

Tell us the story behind your 3D Windsor Castle design...

Andrew Salmon of Creative Exhibitions rang me one afternoon in 2001, with the idea of producing one of the Queen's palaces as the centrepiece for an exhibition at the Olympia stitching show in April 2002. The choice was mine, and I felt that Windsor Castle was the best option. Few of us would recognise Sandringham or Osbourne House, and I might arouse unwelcome interest if I tried to nose around Buckingham Palace!



Did you have to do a lot of research before you began designing it?

I did everything I could think of! I visited the castle twice, taking photographs, notes and the odd drawing, and I bought postcards and borrowed books from the library. The castle had recently suffered a major fire, and a book about this had photographs of the damage, showing inner walls and how some of the towers were constructed, which I found invaluable. I first visited Windsor on September 11th, 2001 – a day none of us will ever forget – but I couldn't begin stitching until after Christmas due to pressure of work. So, I did all the planning then and started stitching as soon as I'd got everyone back to work and university in January!

What 3D projects would you recommend for beginners?

This is tricky. I tend to feel that it's a good idea to be comfortable as a cross stitcher before you start constructing anything too complicated, but everyone's different. As a general rule, the more complicated the shape, the more challenging the construction will be. If you just want to have a go and see how you get on, making dice is a simple

project, although it's unlikely to be true if you want to use it! You don't have to put dots on it if you fancy something more inventive, though. One idea is to put different depictions of weather on each face, and you'll have a weather forecaster!

Where do you find inspiration?

Like most people, there are times when so many ideas fill your head you can't sort them out fast enough, and then times when your brain feels like a desert! Inspiration can be a part of everyday life – a pattern of colours glimpsed in a shop window perhaps - or it can be something you have to hunt down. When that happens, the internet is an invaluable source, but I still turn to favourite books and places when I need to.

Do you keep your work and home craft projects separate?

We live in a live/work unit within a craft centre in the Yorkshire Dales. There's a showroom, a workroom, a storeroom and a flat all within the same complex, so I don't have any excuse for mixing up all the materials with our living space, or for filling my home up with crafty stash!

Is there a big team behind The Nutmeg Company?

There are five of us in The Nutmeg Company at the moment – full- and part-time workers.

What other hobbies do you enjoy, aside from stitching?

We go walking when we can and I always relax with a book for a few minutes a day. I also like pottering around antique shops and country houses. The great designers of old are another source of inspiration for me!

What would you like to be doing in three years' time?

I'd love to still be living in the Yorkshire Dales, still producing things that other people want to stitch, and hopefully contributing to our local community, too.

Blending in

My mum recently bought me some blending filament, but every time I've tried to use it, I get really tangled. What's the best way to stitch with this type of thread?

Becky Champion, Devizes

We love blending filament, as it adds just the right amount of sparkle and sheen to a project! You can either combine it with one or two strands of cotton, or stitch your area in stranded cotton and then go over it with the blending filament. Our top tip is to take your time - as it's made from metallic materials, it's harder to stitch with than cotton thread, so you really need to be



patient! Use a shorter length than normal, and if you find it slips out of the needle, you can knot it to help keep it in place. It's also good to keep your tension light and make sure you're not pulling your stitches too tightly, as this can cause it to snap. Kreinik is our go-to brand for blending filaments as it has a wide range of gorgeous colours! Visit their website at www.kreinik.com.

Back it up

Can you tell me more about iron-on interfacing, and why you use it when making up some of your cross stitch projects?

Joanna Milton, by email

Iron-on interfacing is a layer of fabric that goes onto the back of your aida or evenweave to provide extra strength (ideal when making bags or cushions), and to stop the edges of the fabric from fraying. It also hides the backs of the stitches and makes the whole stitched piece neater. It comes in lots of colours, and the iron-on variety does just that – there's a layer of adhesive on one side, which is activated by the heat and steam of the iron, so it's quick and simple.

Tangled threads

I've just inherited a bundle of DMC threads from my great aunt, but a lot of them are missing the paper bands, so I don't have a way of identifying what shades they are. Do you have any ideas of how I can do this? I tried doing it from DMC's website but the colours didn't match very well.

Help is at hand, Janine, as DMC makes a shade card! This contains a sample of every thread that DMC produces, including the Light Effects and Color Variations ranges. Simply place your threads next to the samples and you'll be able to identify the thread number. This is much more accurate than doing it against a computer screen, which can distort the colour. For taking photos of your stitching

1 Before you take any photos, make sure you've washed and ironed your stitching so that it's looking its absolute best.

Always take a photo in natural daylight. If it's too dark, you won't be able to see the detail of the stitching!

Make sure the photo is clear and sharp. Sit your camera on a table to minimise wobble from unsteady hands.

For best results, remove the glass from a framed piece before photographing. If that's not possible, make sure the source of light isn't reflected in the glass.

Propping the stitching will enhance your photograph. Pose the piece in a nice setting, or ask someone to hold it for you and include them in the shot.

6 If you're sending your photo to a magazine such as *Crazy*, make sure it's large enough. Print-quality images need to be around 1MB.

Go the distance

I'm about to start on an enormous Heaven and Earth project that's over multiple pages, and I'm feeling a little overwhelmed! Do you have any tips for staying motivated, and also the best way to approach it?

Large designs can be a challenge, but the results are definitely worth it! Firstly, keep your project materials neat and tidy, so you don't have to untangle threads or hunt for tools every time you work on it. Set yourself mini challenges, such as completing a certain number of squares, or finishing off one coloured section before you stop for the day. It's also good to have a smaller project on the go at the same time, so you can take a break from the larger project



and return to it feeling refreshed. Good luck, Charlie, and send us a photo when it's complete!



Neat and tidy

Do you have any tips for ensuring the back of your stitching is as neat as the front? I've just started my first big project and I'm struggling with this.

Margaret Callahan, Fife

As well as looking nicer, it's worth making sure the back of your stitching is neat, as this will help your finished piece to lie flat, making it easier to frame. We recommend starting your threads with the loop method if you're using an even number of strands, as this removes the need for a lumpy knot. To do this, take a length of thread, fold it in half, then thread the needle with the two ends. Make your first stitch as normal, leaving a loop of thread at the back, then as you go into the second hole, pass your needle through the loop. This will pull it tight and secure your thread. Another good tip is not to 'jump'

across too large a gap to avoid a

mess of criss-crossing threads. If an area of colour is more than 10 blocks away from the one you're currently stitching, finish off your thread and start again.

Back to black

What's the blackwork method in cross stitch? I've heard it mentioned before, but I'm not sure what it refers to.

Jasmine Taylor, Bath

This is a technique where one thread colour is used in single lines to create beautiful geometric patterns. Traditionally it was done in black thread, hence the name, but it can be done in any colour. In cross stitch projects, blackwork can either be done in backstitch or holbein stitch (double running stitch). The latter uses less thread and means your project will look the same on the back as the front. All you need to do is make a line of running stitches one way, then complete them by coming back the opposite way. For a great introduction to this simple yet effective technique, try our blackwork gift ideas on page 20! These mini makes can be finished over an evening or two, and you can mix and match the colours to suit.



Understanding charts and keys

Follow the steps below for an introduction to getting started, then use the simple instructions opposite to learn each stitch!



Perfect for beginners

Reading the chart

Our charts are printed with coloured squares containing a symbol that represent squares to be stitched on the fabric. The key alongside the chart will tell you what colour thread each symbol corresponds to, so you know which one to thread your needle with (see right).

Where to start


The centre of our cross stitch charts is marked out using small arrows on the edge of each side of the chart. This is the best place to start stitching, so you end up with the design in the middle of the fabric. To find the centre of your fabric, fold it in half horizontally, open it up and fold it vertically. When you open the fabric again, you'll find the creases mark the centre.


Following our keys

All our charts are accompanied by keys that tell you how many strands of thread to stitch in (each length of stranded cotton contains six strands), the thread colours needed (listed in numbers), whether there are backstitch lines, French knots or fractional stitches (see page 81 for details of how to work these), and the size of the design. The thread numbers listed in the first column of the key refer to the brand that we've used to stitch the design, then numbers for two other brands of threads are given. These are not always exact equivalents, but are the closest colour match available.

Finding what you need

Each project includes a shopping list telling you what needle you'll need, and the type and size of fabric required. It'll also include the sizing or details of other products you'll need to frame or finish it in the same way we have.






Getting started

The loop method is the neatest way to start stitching, but can only be done with an even number of strands. Cut a 40cm (16in) thread length, then fold one strand in half. Thread the needle with the ends, forming a loop, and bring the needle up through the fabric. As you take it back down, pass it through the loop and pull firmly to secure.




Backstitch

Backstitch is shown by a coloured line and is added to stitching to create detail. Work the backstitch over individual blocks on aida, or pairs of threads on evenweave. Bring the needle up through the fabric at 1 and take it down at 2, up at 3 and so on, so that you are working back on yourself.




Fractional stitches

To make a quarter stitch, bring the needle up at the corner of a square and take it down through the centre, halfway across the diagonal, splitting the aida block (above left). To turn this into a three-quarter stitch, make a half cross stitch across the other diagonal of the square (above right). This




Cross stitch

You'll need to make a whole cross stitch for each coloured square on the chart. Bring the needle up at the bottom left corner of a square and down at the top right corner. This is called a half cross stitch. Bring the needle up again at the bottom right corner and back down at the top left to finish off the whole cross stitch.




French knots

French knots appear as dots on your chart. Bring the needle up through the fabric, hold the thread down with your left hand and wind it round the needle twice. Still holding the thread taut, take the needle down one thread or part of a block away. Pull through until a neat knot is formed.




creates a half cross stitch across the quarter stitch. If you have to make two fractional stitches back-to-back in the same square, you'll need to decide which is a quarter stitch and which is a three-quarter stitch. Usually, the three-quarter stitch is made in the foreground colour of the design.



TIP Working a row of half cross stitches, then completing the cross stitch on the return journey, is a quick way to work, especially when stitching blocks of colour (see diagram above). TIP Work each half cross stitch in the

same direction, so the top 'arms' of your cross stitches all face the same way.



Spotting fractionals

A fractional stitch is represented on a chart by a smaller version of the main symbol, in a corner of the square. It will show you which corner the fractional stitch should occupy. Ouarter and three-quarter stitches are shown in the same way on your chart.



Finishing your thread

Once you've finished stitching, finish off your threads by running your needle through the back of several stitches that you've already completed. Snip off the ends neatly with a sharp pair of embroidery scissors, as close to your fabric as possible.

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


